He has had previous connections with The Crofton Singers. The choir's first conductor was his godfather, the composer Raymond Warren. Simon sang in the choir himself for a short while before leaving for University. Not only that, his father, Andrew Pusey, was its conductor for a while in the 1970s.

**Dominic Pusey** is reading Music at Leeds University on the BMus course. He studies saxophone with Jim Fieldhouse and as part of this course is hoping to study jazz at the University of North Texas starting in September 2012. He also plays the piano and is a singer/songwriter.
